

Get Involved! Join our MMC Campus Organizations!

Art Club: Formed in 1988, this group strives to promote interest in the Fine Arts. Projects such as building sets for campus events are undertaken annually.

Brothers and Sisters: The Martin Brothers and Sisters are a group of sophomores, juniors, and seniors dedicated to assisting new first-time college students in navigating their way through their first weeks and months of college life. They plan orientation activities and social events for new students, and serve as peer mentors for a small group of 5-7 new first-year students.

Chamber Choir: The choir performs a number of concerts at venues on- and off-campus, throughout the year.

Church Leadership Development Team: The team's mission is to identify, recruit, and train future lay and clergy leaders, and focus on the development of a theological and biblical understanding of leadership.

College Democrats: This group is the official Democratic Party at Martin Methodist College. This club promotes voter awareness at the collegiate, local, and state level, supports the ideals and principles of the Democratic Party, and provides services to the community.

Class of 2015 Student Advisory Board: This group provides student input to the FYE Program Director regarding the needs and interests of First-Year students, and plans fun activities on behalf of the Class of 2015, such as the annual Awards of Excellence and Fantastic Fall Awards ceremonies, Show Your Martin Pride t-shirt sales each semester, and the annual "Roommate Game" which is played like the "Newlywed Game".

Commuter Club ("Road Scholars"): Members represent the commuting students in the "President's Cup" competitions held throughout the year, and sponsor a "Reverse Trick-or-Treating" event for commuters for Halloween, and a campus-wide "All Around Pulaski Riddle Rally" competition open to all Martin students each spring.

Concert Choir: The choir performs a number of concerts at venues on- and off-campus, throughout the year.

Drama Club ("Martin Players"): This group is open to any student interested in drama. Members of this club act in, stage, and help direct the college's Fall and Spring plays.

Fellowship of Christian Athletes: FCA is the largest Christian sports organization in America. FCA focuses on serving local communities by equipping, empowering, and encouraging people to make a difference for Christ.

Film Society: This organization promotes interest in films and filmmaking. They sponsor film-oriented discussions, a Student Film Festival, and a Feature Film Festival in association with the New York Reelabilities Project.

W. Garie Taylor Honors Program: Seeks to promote a community of scholars through the development of challenging curricula, cultural enrichment, and personal interactions with guest speakers who are leaders in the religious, political, academic, business, scientific, and arts arenas.

International Club: This organization promotes interest in the different cultures of the world, and is open to all MMC students.

Martin Methodist Lions Club: This group is an on-campus Lions Club recognized and chartered by Lions International. The Lions Club supports eyesight conservation and community service projects.

Martin S.E.R.V.E.S.: This organization is dedicated to engaging the Martin Methodist community in acts of mercy, justice, and education in order to encourage students, faculty, and staff service as a lifelong activity.

Martinaire Yearbook: The annual yearbook records life at the college. Participation by any student interested in writing, photography, layout, proofing, or typing is encouraged.

Outdoor Enthusiasts Club: This club organizes outdoor activities, such as hiking, biking, and camping trips, which enhance students' appreciation of the great outdoors. They also sponsor the MMC "Survivor" competition held each Fall semester.

Physical Education Club: This is the pre-professional club for prospective physical education professionals.

Praise and Worship Band: This group of vocalists and musicians provides contemporary Christian music during Chapel Services and performs in local area churches.

Pre-Law Society: This group holds lectures and discussions concerning the law and society.

RedHawk Reporter: Martin's campus newspaper, which is published every two weeks.

RedHawk Republicans: This group is the official Republican Party organization at Martin Methodist College. They promote voter awareness at the collegiate, local, and state level, support the ideals and principles of the Republican Party, and provide services to the community.

Relay for Life Team: This group sponsors fundraisers and other activities throughout the year, which promote cancer education and support the work of the American Cancer Society in the fight against cancer. The team also participates in the annual Giles County Relay for Life event in Pulaski.

Residence Hall Council: Every residential community (Upperman, Criswell, and the Apartments) has a residence hall council. Members work with the Head Residents and R.A.s to create a strong sense of community, and a positive environment in which to live and learn within the residential halls.

Rotaract: Rotaract is a Rotary-sponsored service club for young men and women.

Student Activity Council: This group organizes the majority of social activities which occur on campus, and seeks to provide fun and exciting events for all students to enjoy.

Student Alliance for Campus Unity and Equality (SACUE): This organization is open to all students, faculty, and staff members and promotes an awareness and understanding of LGBT issues and concerns.

Student Christian Association: This club promotes a conscious effort to help create and maintain a Christian atmosphere on the Martin Methodist College campus. SCA meets each week in the Jazzman's Café for worship and fellowship, with occasional retreats off-campus.

Student Government Association: SGA consists of student representatives from the freshmen, sophomore, junior, and senior classes, additional representatives, and the elected executive board members. SGA is the voice of the student body; an ideal place for students to discuss their ideas, suggestions, concerns, and issues with one another in the spirit of self-governance. SGA is also committed to maintaining a positive and close working relationship with Faculty, Administration, and Students.

Student Nurse Association: This is the pre-professional club for prospective nurses.

Student Recognition Committee: This group hosts recognition ceremonies and receptions designed to celebrate student and organizational accomplishments throughout the year.

Student Teacher Education Association (STEA): Organized on campus in 1994, this is the pre-professional club for prospective teachers.
